Key Dates to Remember:

- **Wednesday, September 3** First (partial) Day of School for Grades 1–8 (**8:00-11:00**) *Meet on the basketball court if the weather is dry; otherwise, head to the gym.*
- Thursday, September 4 Full day for students grades 1-8; first 1-hour visit for Kindies

Kindergarten Families:

Kindergarten students will begin with a **gradual entry schedule** starting **Thursday, September 4,** to help ease into school routines. Full-day Kindergarten begins **Monday, September 15**. Please refer to the Kindergarten Welcome Letter for full details, including group times, supplies, and bussing information.

We're thrilled to welcome **Ms. Kat Roberge**, who will be leading our K/1 class until Ms. Ladyman returns from maternity leave. Ms. Roberge brings a wealth of experience in early literacy and numeracy and is eager to support your child's learning journey. Other staffing updates will follow as we are still finalizing a few details!

Reminders for All Families:

• Remember our 30km/h School Zone and please be extra vigilant in the parking lot.



- **Drop-off and Pick-up:** Please be punctual and notify the office and your child's teacher of any changes in pickup routines. Safety is our top priority.
- **Bussing:** Contact the transportation department for information about bussing (including registration info) <u>here</u>.
- **Absences:** If your child will be away, please notify <u>the office</u> by email or phone as soon as possible.
- **Prompt and Regular attendance:** There is convincing research indicating the many benefits of regular school attendance. We encourage students to do their very best to be at school ready to learn every day! Our caring staff put a lot of time and expertise into planning sequenced, thoughtful learning paths for students that become more challenging when absences are frequent. We look forward to you making the most of every opportunity this school can offer!
- Cell phones/digital devices: A reminder that cell phones are to be turned off/put on do not disturb on entering the property and kept in a bag (or locker) out of sight for the duration of the school day not on their person (the temptations are too great).
 Students may request permission to call home from the office at an appropriate time if an urgent matter arises.
- **School Supplies:** General classroom supplies are covered by school fees (please pay at the office. Thank you). Your child's teacher may request you to provide a few additional items, depending on class needs. All students must have <u>non-marking indoor shoes</u> in addition to any outside footwear they may personally require. Please ensure all personal items (backpack, shoes, clothing, small water bottle) are clearly labelled.
